Enclosed for your information is a copy of the paper on Eniwetok. The Commission discussed this on June 27, 1972. They did not take any specific action with respect to AEC participation in a rehabilitation program. There was no objection offered to our efforts to clarify the extent of the radiological contamination with funding for work being left for further dialog with the Department of Defense and Department of the Interior.

The General Manager intends to take part in the development of AEC plans for involvement and funding of Eniwetok cleanup. The Nevada Operations Office should plan on keeping the Division of Operational Safety informed of your plans for the radiological survey and other activities in Eniwetok cleanup work to permit coordination with interests of other program divisions in Washington.

We appreciate your assistance and cooperation in the radiological survey program.
