Dear Jim:

As you recall, the Donner Human Use Committee has extended approval of our protocol for study of ⁵¹Cr studies in human subjects. Our studies to date show extremely interesting kinetics of this trace element in 8 patients with hemochromatosis and in one normal subject. Clearly we need to define the normal kinetic pattern with more subjects.

I would like to ask your approval to pay 5 volunteer subjects to take part in this study. The maximum amount of money to be paid to each will be \$150.00, although we may be able to reduce this as we find we don't need some of the data. These are rather long studies--up to 6 months; payment for time will be approximately \$125.00 for 50 hours, and \$25.00 for 500 cc of blood drawn over the whole study.
