Subj: Official Technical Documentary Film of OPERATION OVERLORD, Request for production.

1. It is requested that an official, technical documentary film of OPERATION OVERLORD be prepared, herein, as the primary purpose the provision of an accurate, highly informative, visual record of the combat tank experience. This film would be for immediate use and for future training and study.
2. The projected film will provide, supplement and illustrate the official written history of Joint Tank Force One. It will further serve to acquaint the President of the United States, the Congress, and the higher authorities of the close co-operation with the full scope of the contemplated operations.
3. It will be a vehicle for extensive study, for tactical analysis and for the rapid indoctrination of personnel at the various war colleges and staff schools of the armed services. Definite requirements for a film of such proportion has been established.
4. This documentary will be one of the principal historical compilations of the operation and will have a detailed technical summary and possible staff studies file attached.
5. Production authority will be Commander-in-Chief, A. S. Navy, and Commander, Fleet Air Forces, USAF. The script writer and producer will be Major, Corps, James F. Reilly, USA.
6. Material and liaison will be constantly needed to each of the participating nations of the alliance in order to emphasize the international character and importance of the operation. International participation of the allied nations will be considered as additional technical assistance.
7. Main emphasis in this film will be on technical accuracy based upon official Joint Tank Force reports and historical documents. Attention will be directed toward achievement of pictures accurate and dramatic quality.
8. The master production time is estimated for a film of this proposed dimension. The film will be presented at the Naval Photographic Center, Anacostia, D. C., by way of a working copy of JOINT TAPE PRESS ONE - serial 462. Reproducing rights of the film will be to

9. The approximate number of 35mm sound prints required will be not less than 50.

10. Services required will include animation, editing, titling, sound track and some photographic services. The chief deposit of recorded footage is already at the Naval Photographic Center. The film will make further use of footage exposed by the newsreel and television media and footage in the central and regional files of the Industrial Engineering District and the armed services.

11. The classification of the film will be TOP SECRET until a finished working print is submitted for review at the time of final editing.

12. It is requested that a top priority be given this film project.
