Doar Ataji,

The medical examinations of the Rongelap and Utirik papple which cuccessfully completed. We find it necessary to bring three new thy mid cases to the U.S. for further examinations and possible surgery; one in the Rongelap exposed group and two in the Utiril: emposed group. Thora were no other findings of significance (except one case referred to below) and the peoples' health seemed generally good. The three camer cames from Rongelap were brought to Tripler for examinations and we were alad that after special thyroid examinations there was no evidence of corner remaining. However, a small growth was discovered in region of the pituitary gland. Since she wanted to be with her daughter, for birth of her child, we could not carry out further examinations then but it is very important that she get specialized examinations in the U.S. and she has agreed to return-possibly with the three thyroid cases. I mention this to you to ask your help in case she should not fully appreciate the importance of further examinations. When we beought the three ladies to Tripler there was a regrectful delay in gotting them admitted to the hospital. It seems that a certain paper was not given to us for entrance into the U.S. and immigration held us up a leng this and then in spite of careful preparations for admission to the hespit. there was a dally in getting them admitted. I was nost sormy for this and know the ladies were rightfully upset. I was glad we had langitude Jacob and Aejon Time from Rongelap on hand at the hospital to be with them a good bit of the time.

During our visits to Utirik and Rongelap it was apparent that there was considerable confusion about those eligible for benefits of Poblic Law 5-52. At Utirik the unexposed people thought that they should be entitled to I.D. Cards and at Rongelap they wanted all the children included. The law and the agreement between ERDA and T.T. states that only the people on our examination list (a copy of which is kept at Majuro) are entitled. This includes exposed Rongelap and Utirik people and the special unexposed Rongelap group of 150 people. Therefore, we unexposed Utirik, only some of the unexposed Rongelap and no children are included. We attempted to explain this and also that: the unexposed Rongelap control group was established many years ago (1957) and the neople on this list were selected to match for age and sex people in the exposed Rongelap group. This group is considered quite adequate for both exposed groups and it has not been considered necessary to have unemposed Utivik people as controls. It should be mentioned, however, that all of these people have the benefit of general medical c re at

Another missencephion and, the people was that the slight residual contemination on Rougelas was the cause of the few thyroid notates noted in the tramposed Rougelas people (notatily tore nodules occurred in the unemposed Rougelas people not living on Rougelas). Attempts were used to emploin that the modelaidines ("thyroid poleon"), that caused the thyroid nodules in the Rougelas people was gone (died out) by 2-3 weeks and so there was none of this "thyroid poleon" left; hen the unemposed people moved those. The lovel of other radioisotopes which are not selectively absorbed by the thyroid (as is modiciedine) has been for too low to be of consequence in this regard.

It was a pleasure having John Haglelgom with us end I am sure he has a much better insight date these problems as a result. He indicated that you may visit the outer islands soon. If so, I hope you will be able to help clarify some of the misunderstandings. I am afraid some of the people are blaming our medical team for the stipulations of the law and agreement.
