DAILY INTELLIGENCE ABSTRACTS No. 340.

1. ATOMIC ENERGY. The Embassy in London reports that the House of Commons and the local press are reporting a growing concern over the effects of atomic radiation. Admiral Strauss, Chairman of the AEC, plans a ten day visit to London at the end of April and the Embassy suggests that he should make a major speech on the peaceful uses of atomic energy and report on the progress of the President's atomic energy plan. The Embassy also suggests that Strauss might say more concerning fall-out as reported on February 15, and in that way allay fears. There is wide-spread support in London for an international scientific study of fall-out effects and, if Strauss would indicate US backing for such a study, it would have a favorable psychological impact. 2. CAMBODIA. An FOA police study mission has completed its report on the situation in Cambodia and recommends many changes and improvements in Cambodia's internal security services. The study mission requests the support of all agencies of the US to carry out its two to five year plan which will completely rebuild Cambodia's Army and internal security apparatus.
