



DAILY INTELLIGENCE ABSTRACTS No. 233.

\* 1. JAPAN. Ambassador Allison recommends no further action be taken on compensation negotiations for the radiation victims of the FUEURUYU MARU until the impact of the recent TOYA MARU ferry boat disaster is clear. Japanese officials have evidenced uneasy awareness of possible parallels between the two accidents, the Embassy comments. Further Japanese reasonableness may develop regarding the radiation victims' claims in view of the National Railroad Corporation's apparent carelessness and failure to observe safety regulations in the case of the ferry disaster. 2. KOREA. President Rhee still maintains an inflexible hostility toward Japan and is also apparently afraid that important US officials are pro-Japanese and will support Japan to the detriment of Korea, Ambassador Briggs comments. It is unlikely that President Rhee's state of mind will be materially modified. However, before the US attempts to set up a special apparatus to mediate between Japan and Korea, a further and stronger effort should be made through regular diplomatic channels to persuade Rhee to resume negotiations with Japan, the Ambassador comments. 4. UN. Ambassador Lodge recommends the US "do all reasonably possible" to effect the election of the Pakistani candidate for the vacant seat on the International Court of Justice. The US should not be placed in a position where it might be said afterward that the US-favored candidate had failed for lack of active US support. Ambassador Lodge comments. New York DESIG 34, 29 September 54, C.

5. SYRIA. The outcome of the Syrian elections represents a success for left-wing elements led by Akram Hawrani, the Embassy in Damascus comments. The augmented left-wing strength and the fact that no counterweight to the Army was created assure continued instability in Syria detrimental to US interests, the Embassy comments. 6. MOROCCO. Certain Moroccan Berber troops have revolted against their French officers, ..... No publicity has been allowed, since the French wish to maintain the fiction that nationalism is nonexistent among the Berber tribesmen. ....
