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1. Biology and Medicine

Dr. Dunham said that Dr. ACHEM had recommended that the Rongelap natives be returned to the islands from which they were removed at the time of Operation CASTLE. Also, in view of the necessity of continuing biological tests in the U.S., the Committee had recommended approval of the ten roentgen in ten parts per million for fallout exposure to fallout. Dr. Dunham said the Committee believed that this amount of exposure will not create any appreciable genetic risk to the U.S. population. (Ser 7) (10/25/64).

Mr. Murray then reported about the status of a study being prepared for the Net Evaluation Committee of the NSC concerning the biological consequences of nuclear warfare. He said he wished to receive copies of this and all similar reports prepared by the AEC staff. Mr. Strauss said he had not yet seen this particular report, but that he would consider providing Mr. Murray a copy after he had seen it.
