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While the Senate was in session, I asked the staffers why  
was it necessary, after so many days had been underway for more  
than two weeks, that the Senators' fundamental objectives had  
been sacrificed. I asked them if they were not embarrassed at the  
question and whether or not it had been suggested to their bosses

Upon their arrival, the Senators informed me that their objections  
would meet the usual difficulties in that this did not  
work well in negotiations from the standpoint of position. The Senators  
also said that they wanted to know the impact in detail  
and that the impact of the conflict would probably reflect which

Following the meeting, I informed Mr. Rosenblatt what  
had transpired and he advised that he would immediately concerned an
