1. Conversations with Japan Science Council and Foreign Office indicate acceptability in principle of joint daily communique but Doctor Hiyama of JSC not sure that all Japanese participants would feel bound to confine public remarks to substance these communique. Mission inclined feel Japanese will find press questions hard resist if pursued vigorously. Divulging conference discussions may not be as serious problem as careless comment on peripheral matters not touched on in formal discussions. Inclined suspect reports will seek draw out delegates on subjects like death, compensation, banning H-bomb, et cetera.

2. Foreign Office to furnish representative to work with Salisbury in dealing with press. JSC has agreed to nominate delegate or delegates to aid in drafting communique.

3. Joint Japanese-American press office will be established and facilities for simultaneous English-Japanese releases available.

4. JSC representatives and Foreign Office press officer desire meet with Salisbury and boss November 8 to work out final details press coverage.

5. PAO will meet Salisbury on arrival airport and Embassy press attache detailed work with him during conference.
