Press furor relative death regressed peak of indignation  
 September 26 but comment subsequently obliterated by consterna-  
 tion regarding TOYA MARU accident following day. Only sub-  
 sequent reference has been today's MAINICHI statement that  
 some Americans in Japan consider US victims of TOYA MARU should  
 receive due compensation in light of Japanese FUKURYU MARU demands  
 but that Foreign Office considers accident issues separate and  
 dissimilar. Vernacular MAINICHI additionally quoted Embassy  
 spokesman as saying that if such US sentiment existed he did  
 "not know of any such plans for the moment. Embassy believes  
 MAINICHI story result activities UP reporter.
