SUBJECT: MATTERS FOR YOUR ATTENTION

As usual, matters requiring your attention are both important and urgent. In order to break you into the routine gently, I will offer three for your consideration:

1. Mr. Strauss desires that you journey to New York to brief Henry Cabot Lodge, Jr., on the Japanese situation, patients and tuna. Suggests you do this within the "next few days". (See attached memorandum to Mr. Tamaro)
2. Invitation by the Japanese for one or two U.S. scientists to join in an oceanographic survey of areas around the Marshall Islands and of currents at greater distances. Cruise to commence May 8. Ambassador Allison strongly recommends we accept. State and our public information people concur. Dunham and I dissent. (See telegram no. 2686, May 1, from U.S. Embassy, Tokyo, to Secretary of State)
3. Ambassador Allison recommends Japanese physicians visit air weather personnel-patients at Tripler. Purpose to suggest to Japanese that if their patients receive the same treatment they would look as well as the Tripler patients. Staff here and DOD take dim view. Would present no problem here but for Ambassador's strong recommendation. (See telegram no. 2683, May 1, from U.S. Embassy, Tokyo, to Secretary of State)
