The local press has reported that "radioactive fallouts" were detected, for the first time here, on July 28, by instruments of the National Taiwan University. The Embassy would be interested to learn, under whatever security classification may be appropriate, of the results of analysis of specimens submitted by the Embassy on July 28 and contiguous dates, together with any other data that may be supplied for background or other use, as directed by the Department and the Atomic Energy Commission, in case the Embassy receives inquiries on the subject.
