## AEC 394/12 - Condemnation of Perpetual Easements - Rocky Flats 1. Project

Under consideration was a recommendation by the General Manager that the Commission adopt a resolution for the condemnation of two perpetual easements required in connection with the Rocky Flats Project.

After discussion, the Commission:

Approved the recommendation of AEC 394/12.

The General Manager reviewed the events leading to the preparation of the unclassified report. Mr. Murray and Mr. Zuckert suggested that since the AEC was not in a position to make predictions concerning the cost of power from reactors which may be constructed in the future or the costs of constructing such reactors, the sections of the report dealing with these matters should be deleted or revised.

After further discussion, the Commission:

Noted that the unclassified summary of the Commission's proposed five-year reactor program, as contained in AEC 152/52, would be revised in accordance with the discussion at the meeting and would be circulated to the Commissioners prior to its dispatch to the Joint Committee.

At this point Messrs. Hafstad, Price, Beckerley and Teeple, and Commander Dunford left the meeting and Dr. Bugher and Mr. Hall entered.

5. Incident Concerning Japanese Fishing Vessel (See minutes of Meeting 967)

The General Manager and other members of the staff presented to the Commission the most recent information concerning injuries incurred by the crew of a Japanese fishing vessel subsequent to the first detonation in the present series, Mr. Hall reported on actions which the State Department proposes to take concerning this matter and Colonel Huston reported on the first meeting of an interdepartmental committee, established in accordance with the Commission's request at Meeting 967.

The Commissioners also discussed questions concerning the evacuation of natives from islands in the Marshall Group where significant fall-out occurred. (See minutes of Meeting 966.)

At this point Dr. Bugher and Messrs. Smith, Hall and Thompson left the meeting.
