AEC-DOD DEFINE NEWS POOL FOR PACIFIC  
DEMONSTRATION OF REDUCED NUCLEAR FALLOUT

In furtherance of President Eisenhower's statement of March 26, 1958 that the United States this summer at the Eniwetok Proving Ground will demonstrate to UN scientific and U. S. and foreign press observers progress in reducing radioactive fallout from nuclear explosions, the Atomic Energy Commission and the Department of Defense today defined the U. S. news media representation for the event.

The foreign news media representation is being determined by the State Department.

The U. S. news media group will be as follows:

- 2 morning newspaper news representatives and 2 evening newspaper news representatives (designated by the Standing Committee of Correspondents of the U. S. Congress).
- 1 news representative of each of the principal U. S. news wire services -- The Associated Press, the United Press and the International News Service (designated by their respective managements).
- 3 news still picture pool representatives (designated by the White House Photographers Association).
- 1 news representative of each of the principal U. S. general news periodicals -- Time Magazine, Newsweek Magazine and the U. S. News & World Report (designated by their respective managements).
- 1 radio-television network news representative for each major network (NBC, CBS, ABC, and MBS) and 1 television pool cameraman and 1 radio-television pool sound engineer (designated by the Washington Radio and Television Correspondents Association).
