1. Formal Commission Action.

The Commission authorized Assistant Secretary of Defense Pike to have access to restricted data.

2. Requests and Suggestions by the Commission and Informal Actions.

The Commissioners indicated that they had no objection to the proposed issuance on the conduct of AEC employees. You will recall that Mr. Murray suggested that the section on gambling be re-examined.

The Commission indicated that there was no objection to dispatching a letter to General Vogel on the question of TVA's rates to the AEC and AEC priorities. The Chairman commented that such a letter should be coordinated with the Bureau of the Budget.

The Commission agreed that it would be desirable for the AEC representatives at the International Declassification Conference to visit Belgium for discussions there. We will so inform Mr. Luke and Mr. Hall.

The Commission also agreed that Dr. Richardson's visit to Saclay would be advantageous. We will so inform the staff.

With regard to announcements on overseas and domestic test series, the Chairman asked to be reminded to discuss this matter with the Under Secretary of State. We have done this. The Chairman also observed that a single announcement should be made on both series and that the wording of the announcement should be coordinated with the Department of State and OCB. We will so inform DMA and Information Services.

With regard to the Indian beryl ore purchase contract it was suggested that ODM or AEC might be willing to extend the contract for a year or that FOA might be interested in an extension.
