

Commission Actions

1. AEC 41/4 - Proposed Revision to Rules of the Patent Compensation Board - Approved
2. AEC 413/25 - Content of the Eighteenth Semiannual Report to Congress - Approved. The "Release on Effects" is to be attached as an Appendix and the section on off-site research is to be expanded.
3. AEC 803 - Sale of Heavy Water to Italy - The proposal is approved in principle. A provision providing for return of Fu should be negotiated on a confidential basis, and CDM is to be informed that they may use heavy water as a bargaining point in negotiations for the procurement of mercury from Italy.
4. AEC 152/60 - Draft Report to the NSC on the Status of the Reactor Program - The Commissioners will provide their comments to Mr. Staebler, and he is to provide corrected copies of the report to the Commissioners by Friday if possible.
5. Personnel Actions - The Commission approved your proposals for certain personnel actions.
6. Approval of Minutes of Executive Sessions - The Minute of Executive Session at Meeting 1059 was approved, and the Commission asked that the transcripts be used as the Minutes of Executive Sessions at Meetings 1055, 1056, 1058, and 1062.

Other Business

1. EEL-Ebasco Negotiations - The Commissioners said that they did not wish to reconsider their earlier decision.
2. Mr. Whitman's Trip - The Commission will reconsider its position after the comments of the U.S. Ambassador to Moscow are received.
3. Assistance to Japan - The Commissioners reacted favorably to Dr. Eughar's suggestion regarding U.S. assistance to Japan in the atomic energy field. Mr. Foster is to raise this question at an OCB meeting.
4. OCB Statement on Fall-Out - OCB is drafting a statement which will be submitted to the Commission and is intended to clarify the "Release on Effects."
