Dear Mr. Dial:

On behalf of the Atomic Energy Commission, I am pleased to invite you to witness a shot in the forthcoming 1956 Pacific test series.

Six observer trips are scheduled, the first to depart Washington about April 26 and the others to follow at intervals of about fifteen days. It is planned that observer parties will leave Washington aboard a special mission aircraft about six days ahead of the scheduled date of the shot, be in the forward area about four days, and then return, taking four days for the return trip. In all, the time away from Washington would be some twelve days, more or less.

Because accommodations at the Proving Ground are limited, I would appreciate early information as to whether you can attend and, if so, the period or periods convenient. If your attendance is possible, I shall have one of my staff contact you further relative to details.
