2.	0300			(Ellison 2) Called J-3 at Elmer to request information concerning the SAR DD and any necessary modification to the air and surface radexes. Maj Shultz, the watch officer, said he would call back when he had obtained the information.	Items 49 and 51 of the check list refer.
3.	0330			(Ellison 3) Col Byars called and stated that FLATHEAD had been postponed but that BLACKFOOT would be fired. Col Byars also stated that the postponement messages would be sent from Elmer. No decision concerning the return of JTF 7 personnel to Elmer will be made until after BLACKFOOT has been fired.	
4.	0345			(Ellison 4) On instructions from Capt Coleman, the JOC was secured at 0345.	
5.	0400			(Ellison 5) Col Vest called from Elmer with instructions to re-open the JOC, as it now appears that the FLATHEAD event will be fired as scheduled. JOC re-opened Col Massey and Capt Coleman notified.

8.	0626			FLATHEAD detonated at scheduled secondary time 0626M.	Item 63 of the check list.
9.	0735			Capt Baily, CO of the Curtiss called to advise that at the 0630 weather sounding had a wave guide burn out on the Mark 25. During the call the Mark 25 came back in Operation. Advised Flag of this at 0740.	they
10.	0810			LtCol Epley, JOC Watch Officer at Elmer, called to state that the flight of the R5DZ to Nan had been verified with Eniwetok JOC, and that the plane crew were preparing for takeoff at this time.	80 Item 73 of the check list refers.
