



REC was, at least by implication, committed to recommend a repurchase agreement to the Congress. A repurchase provision had, in fact, been included in the legislation approved by the Commission at Meeting 949 and already concurred in by the Bureau of the Budget. If it could be determined that the deficiency judgment provision now proposed offered unquestionably greater advantages, he would be inclined to favor a change. However, this did not appear to be the case and he therefore found himself unable to support the proposed revision.
