MEMORANDOM FOR THE CHAIRMAN, ATOMIC ENERGY COMMISSION:

SUBJECT: Refund of Armed Forces Participation Funds in Connection with Operation SANISTONE

Reference is made to JCS 1795/6 and JCS 1795/10.

As the Emecutive Agent for the Joint Chiefs of Staff, I now find it apparent that Armed Forces participation costs in connection with Operation SANDSTONE will be substantially less than originally estimated. In order that you may make other legal use of surplus legislative funds, the three Departments have been directed to return \$8,000,000 by 1 May 1918 and to be further prepared to return an additional \$2,000,000 on or about 20 May 1918, when so advised.

Setimated costs for fiscal year 1948 are \$10,000,000; and for fiscal year 1949 are \$4,000,000. It is requested that the funds for fiscal year 1949 be made available at the sarliest possible date.

In connection with the figures above, it should be pointed out that ourrent plans contemplate the establishing of certain facilities at the proving ground to remain in existence after SANDSTONE tests are completed. The facilities will, generally, insure:

The svailability of test sites for long-range observations required by the Atomic Energy Commission; and security of sites as necessary to prevent unauthorized agents securing therefrom valuable scientific data. Because of data not available until tests are completed, the cost of such faciliaties cannot be estimated at the present time, but will be covered by separate request and are not included in the figures above.
