The Commission has conside JCS memorandum dated 16 January 1948 (SE-9476) which relate largely to dissemination of CROSSROADS information within the Armed Forces and which are responsive to the suggestions made in our letter to you of August 8, 1947.

The Commission's understanding of these proposals is, briefly, as fellows:

- 1. All CROSSRCADS information believed by JUS to contain "restricted data" will be divided into two classes on the basis of the principles stated in SM-7968 of 10 April 1947.
- 2. The first of these classes which, for purposes of convenience may be termed "Class A" CROSSROADS information, will be disseminted within the Armed Perces only to personnel who have been cleared for access to "restricted data". Class A GROSSEGADS information includes "restricted data" of a high order of security value. The enterories of CHOSSRUADS information which are within this class are enumerated in SM-7965 and are also referred to in SM-9476. A natice to the effect that specific clearance is required prior to access to Class A CROSSRUADS information will be given by the use of a stamp so stating, in the approximate format presented in 8%-9476.

5. The second of these classes, which may be termed "Class B" · CROSSECADS information, may be disseminated within the Armed Forses in accordance with existing security stendards and practices under appropriate military classifications but without requiring elearance as a condition of access thereto. Class & CROSSROADS information, as defined in SM-7965, contains "restricted data" of only a low order of security importance. Class B CROSSROADS information will identified by a stamp, approximately in the format presented 814-9476, which indicates that specific elegrance is not required At military classification safeguards will be used.
