
"1. TENTATIVE READY DATES:

BEST COPY AVAILABLE

a. Ready Dates: The earliest ready dates for Operation REDWING are stated in order to take advantage of every favorable condition. Shots will be fired as rapidly as technical readiness and weather conditions permit. The term "technical readiness" is meant to include analysis of data from earlier shots which will affect plans for subsequent shots, readiness of the devices, construction, instrumentation status, and readiness of major support elements. However, past experience would indicate that the total length of the shot period could be approximately 2 1/2 to 3 months.
